Network to launch a marketing firm called República. The new company is located in Miami and will focus on the Hispanic market and Latin America.

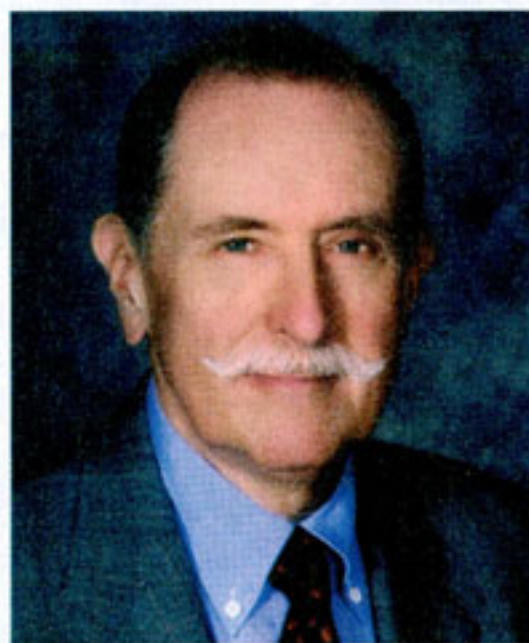
Plasencia was the corporate vice president and operating manager of Univisión Radio.
